	Emergency contact card (physical and digital)
	Flashlight or phone flashlight app
	Whistle or personal safety alarm
	VPN app for secure internet use
	Copies of prescriptions if carrying medication

	Stay aware of your surroundings (avoid distractions with phone)
	Avoid displaying valuables (jewelry, cameras, cash)
	Use well-reviewed and reputable accommodation only
	Always lock up your valuables when leaving your room
	Know local scams (search: "common scams in [destination]")
	Trust your instincts—if it feels wrong, leave
	Be cautious when accepting help from strangers
	Avoid walking alone at night in poorly lit or unfamiliar areas
	Check-in with a friend/family member daily or every few days
<u></u>	Transportation Tips
	Only use licensed taxis or official ride-share apps
	Confirm your driver's name and plate before getting in
	Sit behind the driver, not directly beside them
	Avoid sharing rides with strangers unless it's an official carpool
	Take a photo of the vehicle/license plate when boarding buses or taxis

.0	Staying Social (Safely)
	Don't overshare details of your accommodation with new acquaintances
	Meet new people in public, well-lit locations
	Limit alcohol and always watch your drink
	Keep emergency contacts saved on speed dial
	Have a code word or emoji to send home in case of distress
<u>-Ď</u> -	Emergency Backup Plan
	Know the location of your country's nearest embassy or consulate
	Have emergency cash hidden in a separate location
	Carry a local SIM or international eSIM with data access
	Have a screenshot or written note of your address in the local language

Create a "Just In Case" envelope with photocopies of essential documents, some emergency cash, and a note with your emergency contact details.
